

What is a Gender ? : The form of noun/pronoun word by which we identify whether it is male or iemale or neutral, is called Gender. As : emperor (male), empress (female)

Types of Gender : There are four genders in English language :

- 1. Masculine gender
- 3. Common gender

- 2. Feminine gender
- 4. Neuter gender
- Masculine Gender : Such nouns which refer to male persons/animals are called masculine 1. gender nouns. As : man, boy, actor, king, peacock etc.
- Feminine Gender : Such nouns which refer to female persons/animals are called feminine 2. gender nouns. As : woman, girl, actress, queen, peahen etc.
- Common Gender : These are such noun words which can be used for both male and female 3. persons/animals. As: human, child, ruler, cattle, bird etc.
- Neuter Gender : Such nouns which refer to inanimate or non-living objects are called neuter 4. gender nouns. As : mountain, pen, car, aeroplane etc.
- R Gender related questions are asked in your examination. In such questions, you are asked to convert masculine gender into feminine gender or feminine gender into masculine gender. Sometimes you are asked to fill proper gender words in the blank spaces.

Rule 2. By adding 'ess' to the word to make its Feminine Gender. As :

Note : Nowadays, we use 'author' or 'poet' in place of 'authoress' or 'poetess'.

Rule 3. By removing the last vowel and adding 'ess' to form Feminine Gender. As :

Rule 4. By way of adding 'ess' arbitrarily or by inserting 'ss' or 's', Feminine Gender is formed. As:

Rule 5. Some Feminine Genders are not formed as per above stated rules. As :
